We hosted Picnic with the Ponies at our Willow Hope Farm, welcoming 145 visitors who were eager to learn more about our Equine C.A.R.E. team's incredible work! Thanks to many Hay Bale Heroes, we were also able to stock the loft with enough hay to feed our horses through the winter.

In late August, our CARE-a-van journeyed to Dawson Springs to help residents impacted by the devastating tornado in 2021. We provided free spay/neuter surgeries to the many community cats living in the area. We are excited to return in October to continue this vital work.

This is in addition to the lifesaving work the Kentucky Humane Society does every day to help the thousands of animals who come to us each year in urgent need of care – animals like Cowboy, the injured puppy abandoned on a delivery bag at our doorstep. ## Cowboy's Rescue

Veterinary technician Rebecca van Schepen arrived at KHS early one morning and noticed a dog lying on a delivery bag outside our Admissions Lobby.

The poor four-month-old puppy wasn't moving, and as Rebecca approached, she hoped he was still living. She noticed there was an injury to his front left leg, and he was in too much pain to move.

The sweet puppy, whom we named Cowboy, looked up at her with hurt in his eyes. Security cameras showed that the night before, a car pulled up and dumped Cowboy outside our doors.

"We do not know how Cowboy was injured or who abandoned him, but there was no evidence of road rash, so we do not believe he was hit by a vehicle," said Dr. Emily Bewley, Director of Veterinary Services. "We choose to believe the best in people, so we hope his injury was an accident and that his owner or the person who found him didn't know what else to do."

Cowboy was in a lot of pain and unable to place any weight on his injured leg. Cowboy's x-ray showed that his humerus bone had a severe complete fracture. Dr. Bewley determined emergency amputation was the best option for Cowboy. After surgery, his mood shifted

and he transitioned to life with three legs beautifully! Cowboy spent some time in foster care, and soon after found a loving forever home.

Thanks to your support, KHS can take in desperate animals like Cowboy and give them the lifesaving medical care they need. Because of you, Cowboy was saved. Unfortunately, there are still many animals across Kentucky who are suffering from illness, abuse or abandonment. And as economic hardship continues to impact many residents in our community, KHS is seeing an increase in the number of animals in crisis.

KHS is Kentucky's largest animal adoption agency and spay/neuter provider. Thanks to compassionate people like you, KHS takes in and finds homes for almost 6,000 cats, dogs and horses each year, and provides critical resources to pet owners in need. KHS helps animals not only in Jefferson County, but from all corners of Kentucky.

## Meet Mother Earth

Mother Earth came to KHS from another shelter with her four newborn kittens. Unfortunately, the new mom was suffering from painful and infected burns on her neck. To make matters even more difficult, Mother Earth was diagnosed with Feline Immunodeficiency Virus (FIV), which affects a cat's ability to fight off infection. Because of this, her wounds could have been fatal if left untreated. Our vet team worked quickly to clean her wounds and began her medical treatment. An FIV+ cat can take longer to heal due to their weakened immune systems, so Mother Earth and her babies went to a foster home where they rested and recovered peacefully. After weeks of nursing and healing, Mother Earth's wounds were closed and she was clear of all infection, which meant it was time for her next adventure: adoption! Mother Earth and her four babies – Jupiter, Venus, Saturn and Pluto – are now in their forever homes, safe from the troubled beginnings they once experienced. 🤧









# Reese & Ginger's Road to Recovery

In late-August, the KHS Equine C.A.R.E. team received a call from Louisville Metro Animal Services for our assistance with taking in two emaciated horses. The two mares, 20-yearold Reese and 18-year-old Ginger, were transported to our Willow Hope Farm. Reese came to us with a body condition score of 1 out of 9 – the lowest score possible – with her ribs and spine projecting prominently. An equine veterinarian examined the two sweet horses and created a nutrition plan to help the horses gain weight while avoiding refeeding syndrome, a potentially fatal condition that can lead to system failure if starved horses are fed too quickly. Thanks to your support, Reese and Ginger are on their journey to recovery and getting the love and care they desperately need under the watchful eye of our equine team. Once they are healed and strong, we will work to find these horses the loving homes they deserve. •





# CARE-a-van Helps 'Tornado Cats' in Western Kentucky

Earlier this summer, a Dawson Springs, KY resident emailed KHS to relay the lasting impacts of the December 2021 tornado that ripped through 75% of their town. She noted that Dawson Springs is now home to dozens of stray cats that were abandoned after the tornado, and the unaltered felines continue to breed and exponentially populate. Their community feeds and cares for the cats, but needed assistance in reducing the growing population.

That's where the KHS CARE-a-van was able to help. In August, it rolled out of Louisville in the early morning hours to head to Dawson Springs for two days. We provided free spay/neuter surgeries, vaccines, flea and tick preventative, and other medical care to 56 felines. The day was so successful that the CARE-a-van will return in October for another two days, where they anticipate providing the same care to an additional 60 cats and kittens.

"KHS is truly overwhelmed by the grace and kindness of the lovely people of Dawson Springs, many of whom are still in temporary housing," said Kat Rooks, KHS Kentucky Initiatives Director. "Our team met so many people who are struggling financially and emotionally, yet still find it in their hearts to care for their 'tornado cats' who showed up on their property after the storm.

# Picnic with the Ponies & Hay Bale Heroes

The KHS Equine C.A.R.E. program continues our outreach efforts with teaching the community about Willow Hope Farm. At this year's Picnic with the Ponies, we welcomed 145 new friends to the farm who enjoyed equine demonstrations, tours, family-friendly activities and a spot to picnic alongside our ponies. Our 42-acre farm is home to about 30 horses at any given time, so it is important to continue spreading the word about Willow Hope Farm.

We are so grateful for our Hay Bale Heroes who raised enough money to stock our loft with enough hay to feed our horses through the winter.
